SCHOOL KIDS SENSITISE ADULTS

Since most of the schools were closed, the response has not been good. However, NGO Aseema that has adopted a Municipal School in Chimbai participated, where kids helped create awareness outside the school.

Apart from Aseema, children from Beacon High School also lined up at the junction of Linking Road and Khar Danda Road (CD Marg).

Says Sumaira Abdulali of Awaaz Foundation, "It is innovative way of reaching out to the students. While visiting the schools I did interact with the students and the feedback that I received was good."

In fact, when the kids go and talk to their parents, it does make more of a difference. She said, "There is certainly an awareness on the issue of noise pollution because many students did concede that noise due to honking and traffic disturbed their peace of mind.
